Goal: Skilled Teachers <i>During the 2019-20 school year, teachers will dedicate at least ten minutes to “technology talk” per week during collaborative planning sessions to determine how they will build digital citizenship in their classrooms. Teams create their own plan for exploring the technology they discuss. Teachers will indicate the time and brief explanation for technology use on their weekly lesson plans.</i>
